## Wilson College Honors Athletic Trainer at Annual Holiday Awards Luncheon

**CHAMBERSBURG, PA.** – Wilson College honored employees at its 10<sup>th</sup> Annual Holiday Awards Luncheon held Dec. 19 in the college dining hall. Several outstanding service awards were presented by Wilson College President Barbara K. Mistick.

The Outstanding Service to Students Award, which is given to an employee whose contributions strengthen the quality of student life, was presented to Tracy Randall-Loose, Head Athletic Trainer. Randall-Loose, of

Chambersburg, joined Wilson College in 2003. She received the award for her selflessness in helping student-athletes, including working long hours, caring for about 85 student-athletes in 7 sports, and leading a peer group of student-athletes in Alcohol and Drug Prevention Programming and Leadership Education. Tracy is also the Drug Testing Coordinator, an American Red Cross Instructor, an Adjunct Professor for the Exercise and Sports Science Department, and is on the Campus Safety Committee. Athletic Director, Lori Frey, nominated her for this award. Tracy received a certificate of accomplishment and a check for \$100.

Tracy Randall-Loose is a 1990 graduate of West Chester University. She received her M.Ed. from Wilson College in 2009. Before coming to Wilson College, Tracy worked for Healthsouth in Birmingham, Alabama with the renowned Orthopedic Surgeon Dr. James Andrews and Physical Therapist Dr. Kevin Wilk. During her 13 years with Healthsouth, she worked with high schools, colleges, professional athletes, movie stars, the Colorado Silver Bullets professional baseball team, and traveled with the Royal Family of Saudi Arabia. Tracy worked as Head Athletic Trainer to Birmingham-Southern

College where they won the 1995 National Championship for Men's Basketball and in May 2000, she was inducted to the Birmingham-Southern College Sports Hall of Fame.

Tracy has worked with many USA Olympic Teams since 1992. She was a staff Athletic Trainer at the USA Olympic Training Center in Colorado Springs, CO from 1995-1996. She was a member of the Medical Staff at the 1995 World University Games in Fukuoka, Japan, the 1996 Summer Olympic Games in Atlanta, Georgia, the 2003 Paralympics Sitting Volleyball World Championship in Shanghai, China, and many Olympic and Paralympics Team Trials and World Championships. Tracy was honored to be the First Athletic Trainer to travel with the First Sanctioned USA Women's Baseball National Team. Two of Tracy's team pictures are hanging in the Baseball Hall of Fame at Cooperstown, one with the Colorado Silver Bullets and one with USA Women's Baseball. Tracy also attended the Baseball Hall of Fame ceremony as a special guest when Phil Niekro was inducted to Cooperstown in 1997.
