## Student Scholarship Awards

### Richard M. Burkholder Scholarship

Dick Burkholder is an untiring servant of the profession and the athletes he serves. The Richard M. Burkholder Award is given to a student who has a desire and eagerness to gain knowledge not only in the classroom but also through observation skills – and has insight of how these skills and knowledge can be used to evaluate early health problems and apply them to treat the athlete and use them in practicing his or her chosen health profession. Like “Burke”, the person awarded this Scholarship should have a great sense of humor and be committed to helping others in the profession.

### Phillip B. Donley Scholarship

Phil's Athletic Training Education Program was not only the first in the State, but also the first Co-ed program in the country. In 1965, he established a Co-ed athletic training room when few schools had one. He was a pioneer in helping women enter the field and hired the first full-time female athletic trainer in 1966. Along with Bud Miller they were the heart and soul of early athletic training education. Phil is dedicated to the profession and is always there when you need him in professional organization matters. He continues to work behind the scenes to get things done and pushes his peers to step forward to take leadership roles. The Phillip B. Donley Award seeks to distinguish the student who is also dedicated to the profession – who not only distinguishes themselves academically, but more importantly, clinically and through volunteerism. It is the student who is well-rounded and who has shown themselves to go that “extra mile” – not just what has been assigned to them throughout their curriculum.

### NATA District II – Joe Iezzi Scholarship

Joe has been the Head Athletic Trainer at Cheyney University, Philadelphia University, and Downingtown West High School. He works tirelessly for the profession and has been in many professional leadership roles within the State, District, and National levels. Joe Iezzi has mentored many students and has helped mold and shape their careers and lives.

### PATS, Inc. Scholarship

The Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society believes that the strength of this Society is derived from the membership and the values we uphold. These values include: possessing a deep passion for the athletic training profession, holding the highest professional standards by practicing moral and ethical behaviors, valuing camaraderie and collaboration, and exhibiting adaptive, flexible, and creative solutions.

### Cecilia Yost Scholarship

As the first female to be elected President of the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society, Inc., she was also the first athletic trainer from the secondary school setting. These two groundbreaking accomplishments of historical significance make Cecilia Yost a shining star in the profession of athletic training in the Commonwealth. Because of Cecilia, the path was forged for women to ascend the ladder within the profession of athletic training. Even more importantly, she has strived to mentor those students seeking a career in the field while also constantly being a valuable resource for all of our young professionals. To that end, this award is specific to a rising senior (junior class applicant) who has shown his or her potential for having a unique impact on the profession and the PATS organization.

## Team Physician Honorary Membership Award

*Craig L. Stabler, MD*

Dr. Stabler has directed and supported athletic trainers in the Williamsport area, and specifically Montoursville High School, since 1989. During these 25 years of service, he set the standard for orthopedic care and support of athletic trainers in the north central part of the state. He began an outreach athletic training program through his role as Medical Director for the Susquehanna Health Sport Medicine Center, a position he held until his retirement last year. During his tenure, he grew what began as just one athletic trainer position with a single local high school to a current staff of sixteen athletic trainers providing services to fifteen high schools, one middle school, and one college. Additionally, he developed a staff of five athletic trainers that work daily in physician extender roles.

In addition to his duties with Susquehanna Health, Dr. Stabler provided medical care for Mansfield University's football program until its closure in 2006. He also served as the Medical Director for the PIAA Division 4 All-Star Football game for over twenty years.

A member of the Lycoming County Medical Society, Pennsylvania Medical Society, and American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons, Dr. Stabler received dual degrees in biology and chemistry from Indiana University of Pennsylvania and his Doctor of Medicine from the Jefferson Medical College of Thomas Jefferson University in Philadelphia.

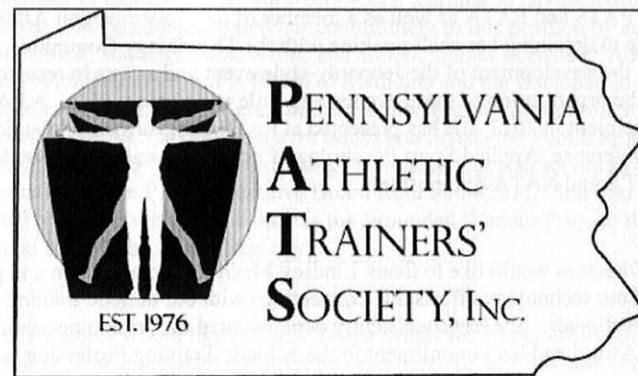
# The Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society

During her educational experiences in graduate school at East Stroudsburg University and Temple University, Lindsey has been able to accomplish a unique list of service and volunteer activities within the scope of athletic training. She has worked with the East Penn Speed Skating Club, Universal Cheerleaders Association, Lehigh Valley Outlawz Arena Football, USA Women's Lacrosse, Inter-County Scholastic Hockey League, Big 33 Football Classic, and the Central American & Caribbean Games in Puerto Rico. She has been able to experience these types of athletic training opportunities all while attending graduate school and fulfilling her responsibilities as an Adjunct Professor at East Stroudsburg University.

Within PATS, Lindsey became the first chair in 2009 of the Technology Committee, implementing a new website, creating PATS social media outlets, and assisting other committees with tech projects and goals. In 2010, she became a member of the Quiz Bowl Committee for PATS and EATA as well as a member of the Governmental Affairs Committee, all while maintaining her chair position with the Technology Committee. She is responsible for the development of the Jeopardy-style event and assists in researching questions and the organization of these events with little to no recognition. A PATS Research Grant recipient in 2013, she has presented at PATS, the Northeast Atlantic Sport Psychology Conference, Applied Sport Psychology Conference, and been a workshop assistant at EATA and NATA Symposiums.

## 2014 PATS SERVICE AWARD



**Tanya L. Miller**

As one of the 2014 recipients of the PATS Service Award, Tanya Miller has consistently exceeded expectations as a PATS member. In her 16 years as a certified athletic trainer, she has worked to continually improve quality of service to her athletes and education of her administration and colleagues.

In 1998, Tanya began her journey in Athletic Training after graduating with a combination degree in Biology from Shippensburg University and Athletic Training from West Chester University by accepting a position as the Assistant Athletic Trainer at Susquehanna University. Returning to graduate school at Bloomsburg University a year later, she worked with Bloomsburg High School and then Central Columbia High School as well as football and wrestling at Bloomsburg University. Tanya moved onto Elizabethtown College as the Assistant Athletic Trainer (2001-2010) and then Head Athletic Trainer (2010-2013). An opportunity opened for her to return to her alma mater, Shippensburg University, where she is currently the Assistant Director of Sports Medicine.

While completing her duties related to her employment positions, Tanya has served in many capacities within PATS. She has chaired the Governmental Affairs Committee since 2011 and was a member of that committee for many years, learning to navigate this venue from George Roberts. She has demonstrated her commitment to this position by addressing such issues as concussion, sudden cardiac arrest, and athletic trainer licensure. 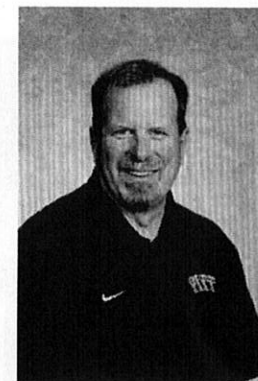
The DMA is awarded to a PA certified athletic trainer who has been in practice for a minimum of 10 years and deserves merit for demonstrated excellence in one of the following settings:

## PATS DISTINGUISHED MERIT AWARD 2014



**Robert Blanc**

Robert Blanc, MS, LAT, ATC, has been a certified athletic trainer for more than 30 years. Currently going into his 27<sup>th</sup> year this fall as the Head Athletic Trainer for Football at the University of Pittsburgh, Rob has also served as the head athletic trainer at New Lexington (Ohio) High School (1983-1984) and Duquesne University (1986-1988). He also worked as a part-time assistant athletic trainer with the NFL Pittsburgh Steelers (1984-1990) and as an EMT/Paramedic with Tri-Community South in his community of Bethel Park, PA, for 17 years (Dec. 1982-Jan. 2000). Additionally, he has served as a clinical coordinator, athletic performance director, lecturer, and advisor to the university's planning team that focuses on the welfare of all student-athletes. Rob has served PATS and our profession through his work as a former Chair of the PATS Clinical Symposium (1995-1998), Co-Chair of the Panther Performance Team (health and wellness), and member of the NCAA Self-Study Certification Committee. Named the 2013 NCAA Division I Head Athletic Trainer of the Year by the NATA, Rob has written many journal publications and textbook chapters, co-authored the textbook *Emergency Care in Athletic Training*, and presented at several professional symposium, including the NATA, EATA, and American Orthopaedic Society for Sports Medicine. Rob deserves the Distinguished Merit Award for excellence as an Athletic Trainer in the College/University setting and for his positive influence on student-athletes, our profession, and the professional organizations he serves.

**Edwin A “Sandy” Bush, Jr.**

Edwin A. “Sandy” Bush, Jr., MS, LAT, ATC, has been a certified athletic trainer for 36 years, spending most of those (31 years) at Messiah College as the Head Athletic Trainer (26 years). He is the current Athletic Training Program Curriculum Director and Student Clinical Supervisor. Previously, Sandy was an assistant athletic trainer at South Dakota State University (1980-1981), the University of Pennsylvania Sports Medicine Center (1981-1983), and interim head athletic trainer at Haverford College (1983). He has held many committee positions in state and national organizations within our profession including the PA Board of Physical Therapy Athletic Trainers Advisory Committee (1995-1997), NATA JRC-AT Self-Study Committee (2002-2003), and CAATE Planning Committee (2006-2007) as well as a member of numerous PATS committees. Sandy was also on the PATS Executive Board as the South Central Representative (1997-2001). Currently, he serves on the following PATS committees: Governmental Affairs (since 1985), Hall of Fame (since 1997), and History and Archives (since 2002). Someone who has spoken to many professional medical societies across the state, he has been an athletic training education program accreditation reviewer since 1989 and a recipient of the Northern High School Education Service Award (1998) and the PATS Service Award (2003). Also active in his church and community, Sandy deserves the Distinguished Merit Award for excellence as an Athletic Trainer in the College/University setting and for his positive influence on students, athletes, our profession, and the professional organizations he serves.

**Thomas F. West**

Thomas F. West PhD, LAT, ATC, has been a certified athletic trainer since 1990 and has worked diligently in providing health care and education for the athletes and students of George Washington University (1993-1995), Penn State University (1995-1997), Lock Haven University of Pennsylvania (1999-2004), and California University of Pennsylvania (2004-present). Serving as an athletic trainer and educator, he has been a program director of both undergraduate and graduate athletic training curriculum programs at Lock Haven and CalU as well as Chairperson of the Department of Health Science at CalU (2009-2013). An accomplished presenter, manuscript and program reviewer, and master’s thesis chairperson, Tom has served our profession in many positions at the state and national level. He has been a member or chair of the PATS Long Range Planning Committee, Poster Review Committee, Finance Committee, Convention Committee, and, most recently, on the PATS Executive Board as President-Elect, President, and Past-President (2006-2012). Additionally, he serves on the national level as the Commission on Accreditation of Athletic Training Education (CAATE) Site-Visit Chairperson and was the NATA District II PA Representative for both the Research and Education Foundation and District II Programs in Athletic Training. A recipient of the PATS Chuck Medlar Award and finalist for both the CalU Presidential Gala Faculty Award and the Olympic World Congress Prince de Merode Award, Tom deserves the Distinguished Merit Award for excellence as an Athletic Trainer in the Educator/Researcher category and for his positive influence on student education and development, our profession, and the state and national professional organizations he serves.

# The Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame

The Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame was created by the PATS' Board of Directors in 1999. The hall of fame is a state-wide honor that is administered and funded by PATS, Inc. and our society's most prestigious award.

The inaugural class was in 2000 and inducted 11 members. Since the initial class, a total of 42 members have been inducted. This includes 38 athletic trainers, 6 physicians, and 1 state senator. Today, 3 new members will join this prestigious group.

The 32" x 18" framed keystone shaped certificate is signed by the current PATS president and HOF chair. It is inscribed with the words "Whereas the recipient has brought distinction and honor to the profession of athletic training through a commitment to excellence, dedication and valued contributions in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania"

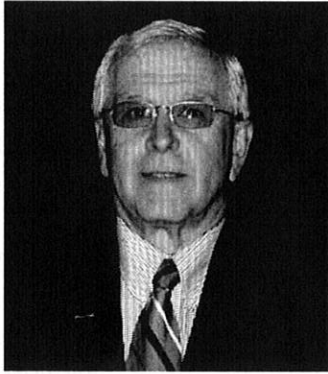

## 2014 Hall of Fame Inductee



**Joseph Donald Donolli**

Mr. Joseph Donolli epitomizes family, sacrifice, tolerance, and a genuine concern for those around him. He has been a loyal advocate and distinguished servant for his country with the United States Army, the profession of Athletic Training, and the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society (PATS). Joe was raised on Long Island, New York before moving to Pennsylvania. He played football and graduated from the University of Delaware with a Bachelor's degree in Health, Physical Education, Recreation, and Dance in 1966. In 1967, he completed a Master Degree in Therapeutic Physical Education at Temple University.

While his active duty service in the US Army ended in 1970, Mr. Donolli immediately enlisted in the PA Army National Guard and served admirably until his retirement 25 years later, retiring as a Lieutenant Colonel. He has been awarded many military merit awards during this time including the Bronze Star, Army Commendation Medal, and the Republic of Vietnam Campaign Medal.

Additionally in 1970, after Mr. Donolli returned from Vietnam, he began working as an Athletic Trainer at Millersville University. In 1971 he was hired at Gettysburg College to fill many roles including: the Assistant Athletic Trainer, an Associate Professor of Kinesiology, a Student Advisor, the Head Lacrosse Coach, and an Assistant Wrestling Coach.

In 1988, after 16 years, Mr. Donolli stepped down as Head Lacrosse Coach to become only the 3rd Head Athletic Trainer in Gettysburg College history. His predecessors were Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers Hall of Fame members, Romeo Capozzi and Gareth "Lefty" Biser. This is truly quite remarkable as the position, was established in 1927 and now includes three Hall of Fame Members.

In 2010, Mr. Donolli stepped down as Head Athletic Training to once again be an assistant and officially retired from Gettysburg College in 2013.

While the consummate Athletic Trainer, Mr. Donolli helped in the building of an extensive, well respected and effective Athletic Training Internship Curriculum program within Gettysburg's Liberal Arts College which promoted, encouraged, mentored and taught students in the field of athletic training. In the mid 1990's Gettysburg had as many as 32 aspiring athletic training students studying athletic training via the internship route. Mr. Donolli is an excellent example of what an athletic trainer should be, hosting many events, educating students, providing great care to his student-athletes, and advocating for the profession he cared for deeply. He was recognized and inducted into the Gettysburg College Hall of Athletic Honor in September of 2013.

Additionally, Mr. Donolli has served PATS in several capacities including professional presentations and attendance at important legislative meetings on behalf of PATS in Harrisburg. Mr. Donolli was the Facilities Coordinator for the Convention Committee and Chaired the Convention Committee from 1999-2001. Since 2002, he serves as Chair of the Hall of Fame Committee,

Mr. Donolli has worked with U.S. Olympic athletes and volunteered as an Athletic Trainer for the Pennsylvania Special Olympics at the Pennsylvania State University and the U.S. Senior Olympics held at the University of Pittsburgh. He continues to be active in the American Heart Association as an instructor, where he continues to teach various CPR and First Aid classes in the community.

Serving is clearly important to Mr. Donolli as he is also an extremely active member of the Prince of Peace Episcopal Church. He serves the church in many ways including as a Junior and Senior Warden of the Vestry, helping with the Decorating Committee, Pancake Day, the Silent Auction, and the Bazaar as well as serving as an Usher.

Mr. Donolli has been married to Olive Kathryn Donolli for over 40 wonderful years always striving to find the appropriate work-life balance. They have three beautiful daughters, Jacqueline, Danielle, and Stephanie.

Joe Donolli, your genuine affection for others, sacrifices, and service is unmatched. Congratulations and welcome to the **Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Hall of Fame 2014.**

## 2014 Hall of Fame Inductee



**Glen L. (Larry) Cooper**

Glen L. (Larry) Cooper, also known as “Coop,” is a product of Western Pennsylvania parenting, education and athletics. He grew up in Greenville, PA where he excelled in school and as a wrestler. Larry started his academic career at Thiel College where he wrestled and majored in Business Administration. It did not take him long to realize that what he really wanted to do was be more active and involved with sports and guiding young people. He transferred to the University of Pittsburgh and in 1984; he graduated with a Bachelor of Science in Health, Physical Education and Recreation Education Degree with a specialization in Athletic Training.

Coop spent his initial teaching years in Virginia at three different schools, teaching health classes, physical education and adapted physical education while working as an athletic trainer. In these roles he developed a student athletic training program, worked on curriculum development and a pilot elementary health class. He worked with other AT’s to develop policies both locally and regionally to safeguard all student athletes.

During this time Larry solidified the fact that his future was in the secondary schools as a teacher and athletic trainer. He came back to Pennsylvania and has been at Penn-Trafford High School for the last 23 years. He is devoted to the profession and “loves” being an athletic trainer. Coop relishes being a mentor to many students over the years who have gone on to become involved in health care as AT’s, PT’s, PTA’s, PA’s and Orthopedic Surgeons.

Coop has been active in the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers’ Society PATS at the Executive Board level serving as both the Southwestern Representative and Parliamentarian. At the Committee level, Larry has either served as a member or a Chair of PATS’ Membership, Long Range Planning and Secondary School Committees. Annually he holds Weight Assessor workshops for newly licensed Athletic Trainers within the Commonwealth. He is also a founding member of the WPIAL Sports Medicine Advisory Committee.

At the National level, Larry has served both as the District 2 Representative and the Chair of the Secondary School Athletic Trainers Committee, an Advisory Member to the NATA Appropriate Medical Care for Secondary School-Age Athletes Task Force, serves on the National Federation of High School State Associations Sports Medicine Advisory Committee, a contributing writer of the NATA Position Statement of Fluid Replacement for the Physically Active, a contributing writer for the NATA Inter-association Task Force for Preventing Sudden Death in High School Sports paper and the NFHS Sports Medicine Handbook and served as a committee chair of the NATA Inter-Association Consensus Statement of Best Practices for Sports Medicine Management for Secondary Schools and Colleges.

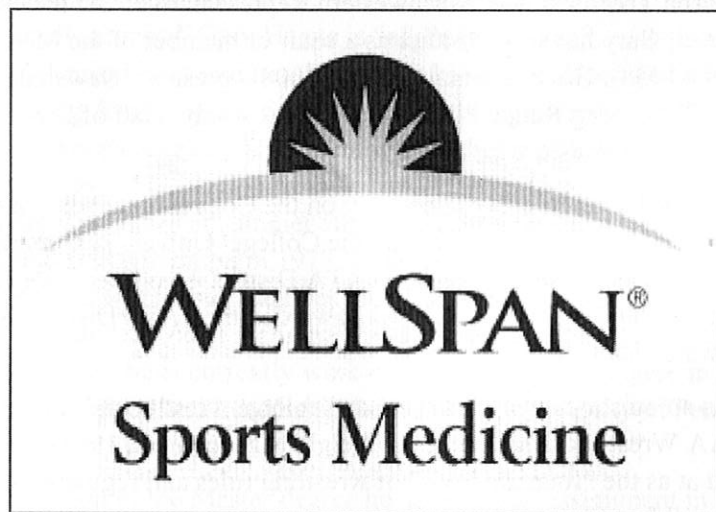
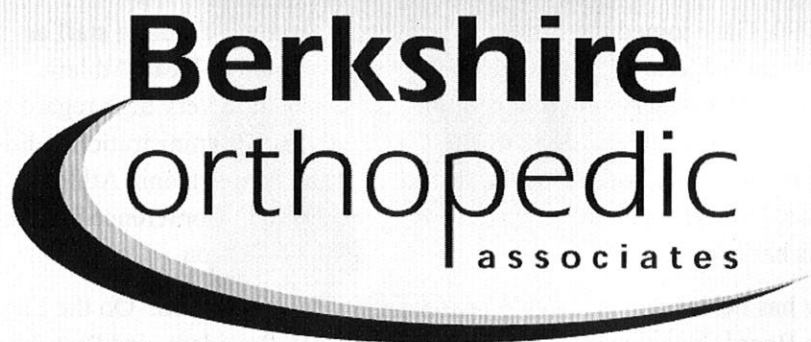
