PATs Student Scholarship Awards

NATA District II - Joe Iezzi Scholarship

Joe has served as Head Athletic Trainer at Cheyney University, Philadelphia University, and Downingtown West High School. He continues to work tirelessly for the profession and has held many professional leadership roles within the State, District, and National levels. Joe Iezzi has mentored many students and has helped mold and shape their careers and lives.



PATs, Inc.- Otho Davis Scholarship



In 1976, Otho Davis was the National Executive Director of the National Athletic Trainers' Association and was also the principal individual who gathered our founding fathers together in Mechanicsburg, PA to create the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society, modeled after the NATA. Otho was a "bigger than life" individual who had the bold vision to organize Athletic Trainers in the state to protect the profession in the uncertain political climate of that time. This award embodies the deep passion of our founding fathers, which holds its

members to the highest professional standards by practicing moral and ethical behaviors, valuing camaraderie and collaboration, and exhibiting adaptability, flexibility, and creativity.



Cecilia Yost Scholarship

In addition to being the first female elected President of the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society, Cecelia Yost was also the first athletic trainer from the secondary school setting to serve in this role. Through these groundbreaking accomplishments, Cecilia Yost has helped forge a path for women to ascend the ladder within the profession of athletic training. Even more importantly, she has strived to mentor students seeking a career in the field, while also constantly being a valuable resource for all of our young professionals. To that end, this scholarship is awarded to a student who has demonstrated potential for having a unique impact on the profession and the PATS organization.



Richard M. Burkholder Scholarship



Dick Burkholder is an untiring servant of the profession and the athletes he has served. The Richard M. Burkholder Award is given to a student who has a desire and eagerness to gain knowledge not only in the classroom, but also through application of skills and knowledge to evaluate early health problems and provide care. Like "Burkie," the person awarded this scholarship should have a great sense of humor and be committed to helping others in the profession.



Phillip B. Donley Scholarship

Phil Donley's Athletic Training Program was not only the first in the state, but also the first co-ed program in the country. In 1965, he established a co-ed athletic training room when few schools had one. He was a pioneer in helping women enter the field and hired the first full-time female athletic trainer in 1966. Along with Bud Miller, they were the heart and soul of early athletic training education. Phil was dedicated to the profession and was always there when you needed him in professional organization matters. He continued to work behind the scenes to get things done and pushed his peers to step forward to take leadership roles. The Phillip B. Donley Scholarship distinguishes the student who is also dedicated to the profession – who not only distinguishes themselves academically, but more importantly, clinically, and through volunteerism. It is the student who is well-rounded and is willing to go that “extra mile” beyond what is assigned to them throughout their curriculum.

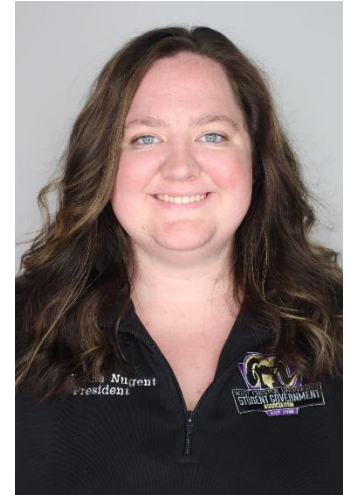

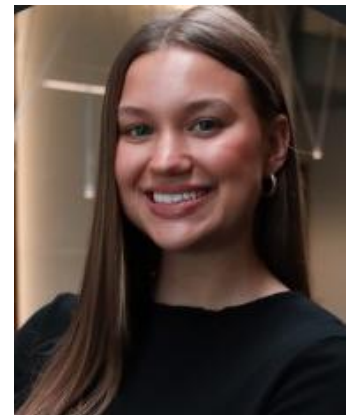

Jessica Johns is the director of sports medicine at Duquesne University, where she has worked as an athletic trainer since 2018. For over a decade, Jessica has served PATS through her involvement and leadership on multiple committees, including the Public Relations Committee (2015-2019), Young Professionals Committee (2016-2019), and Convention Committee (2024-present). Jessica has also served as Allegheny County Delegate for the PATS Southwest Region since 2021 and has been involved with PAT-PAC since 2023, advocating for the profession's legislative interests and promoting member engagement. Beyond Pennsylvania, Jessica also serves as Public Relations Committee Chair for EATA (2024-present).

Ryanne Ziobro, MEd, LAT, ATC

Ryanne Ziobro is a clinical professor and athletic trainer at King's College, where she has worked as an athletic trainer since 2005. Ryanne has served on the PATS Public Relations Committee for almost 20 years (2006-present), chairing the committee from 2009-2011. During this time, Ryanne has helped lead multiple initiatives including educating legislators about the profession, educating high school guidance counselors about athletic training as a field of study, and educating the public to emphasize athletic training as a healthcare profession. During National Athletic Training Month, Ryanne has helped PATS win multiple awards for greatest impact and best overall campaign. She has also served PATS by attending "Hike to Harrisburg" and "Hit the Hill Day" to promote the AT profession among legislators.

Outside of PATS, Ryanne has volunteered as a provider at the PA Special Olympics and the Scranton Steamtown marathon, has organized fundraisers for leukemia, lymphoma, esophageal cancer, and brain cancer research, and developed a non-profit called Pat Shotwell's Faith Over Fears that raises money for pancreatic cancer research.

PATS Distinguished Merit Award

The PATS Distinguished Merit Award was created by the PATS Executive Board to honor those individuals who have demonstrated exemplary professional practice achievement in their respective employment setting.

The DMA is awarded to a Pennsylvania licensed athletic trainer who has been in practice for a minimum of 10 years and deserves merit for demonstrated excellence in one of the following settings:

1. Secondary School (High School)
2. College/University
3. Professional Sport
4. Clinical/Industrial
5. Educator/Researcher

These athletic trainers are awarded for their excellence in their primary fields of practice and positive influence on patients, athletes, students, administrators and organizations they provide service for in their role as a professional employee.

Shelly Fetchen DiCesaro, PhD, LAT, ATC

Dr. Shelly DiCesaro is an associate professor in the Department of Sports Medicine & Nutrition at the University of Pittsburgh, and an athletic trainer for the U.S. Olympic figure skating team. Shelly's sustained professional excellence, visionary leadership, and unwavering commitment have strengthened our profession and created a lasting impact, with achievements spanning clinical practice, education, research, and service

As PATS president, Shelly guided the society through the COVID-19 pandemic, while maintaining a sense of community and fostering continued engagement. She has been a leader in policy development, organizing the PA Team Up for Sports Safety Summit in Pittsburgh, and overseeing the development of PATS initiatives such as the PATS/ATSNJ Speaker Exchange, the PATS Week of Service, PATS Speakers' Bureau, and two new committees with Community & Youth Activities and Membership Engagement & Value Committees.

In addition to her work in Pennsylvania, Shelly also serves as EATA President-Elect, and is a member of the NATA Foundation Scholarship Committee.

The Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame

The Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame was created by the PATS Executive Board in 1999. The Hall of Fame is a state-wide honor that is administered and funded by PATS, representing our society's most prestigious award. The inaugural class in 2000 inducted 11 members. Since then, a total of 58 members have been inducted. This includes 51 athletic trainers, six physicians, and one state senator.

The framed keystone-shaped certificate that each Hall of Famer receives is inscribed with the words:

"Whereas the recipient has brought distinction and honor to the profession of athletic training through a commitment to excellence, dedication, and valued contributions in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania."

PATS is pleased to recognize Ms. Tanya L. Miller, MS, LAT, ATC, CES as the 2026 inductee into the Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame.

2026 Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame Inductee



Tanya Miller, MS, LAT, ATC, NASM-CES



Tanya Miller has made extensive and impactful contributions to the profession of athletic training in the Commonwealth, championing legislative and licensing efforts as Chair of the PATS Governmental Affairs Committee (2011-present), serving on the PATS Executive Board, and being the liaison between PATS and the State Boards of Medicine and Osteopathic Medicine.

Tanya's career has spanned Pennsylvania: she studied biology at Shippensburg University and athletic training at West Chester University, before completing a master's degree at Bloomsburg University and post-graduate work at California University of Pennsylvania. She has worked as an athletic trainer at Susquehanna University (1998-1999), Bloomsburg High School (1999-2000), Central Columbia High School (2000-2001), Elizabethtown College (2001-2003), CIP Solutions (2009-2015), and she currently serves as the Assistant Director of Sports Medicine at Shippensburg University, where she has been since 2013.

Tanya has been involved in national and state governmental affairs work; been part of the medical teams for NCAA Division II national, regional, and state events; and has authored and presented clinically relevant publications on emergency action planning and guidelines for sports participation in hot and cold weather. In addition to her work to advance the profession, Tanya has contributed to the development and passing of the landmark legislation of the PA Safety in Youth Sports Act in 2011 and the Sudden Cardiac Arrest Prevention Act in 2012.

PATS Research Grant Award

The purpose of the PATS Research Grant is to facilitate the advancement of the Athletic Training profession. Initiated in 1993, the PATS Supported Research Program offers a unique opportunity for members of the Society. The grant, in an amount of up to \$5,000, is awarded to basic, applied, and service-related research that incorporates an interdisciplinary approach between the Athletic Trainer and other health care researchers.
