The Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame was created by the PATS' Board of Directors in 1999. The hall of fame is a state-wide honor that is administered and funded by PATS, Inc. and our society's most prestigious award.

The inaugural class was in 2000 and inducted 11 members. Since the initial class, a total of 40 members have been inducted. This includes 34 athletic trainers and 6 physicians. Today, 2 new members will join this prestigious group, including the first state senator.

The 32" x 18" framed keystone shaped certificate is signed by the current PATS president and HOF chair. It is inscribed with the words "Whereas the recipient has brought distinction and honor to the profession of athletic training through a commitment to excellence, dedication and valued contributions in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania"

The Honorable Senator
Robert (Tommy) Tomlinson

Today is a culmination of a celebration that began six months ago when Governor Corbett signed our professional Licensure bill into law in December 2011. Senator Robert "Tommy" Tomlinson was our principle legislative supporter for the previous 2001 Bill (signed by then-Governor Mark Schweiker) that transferred athletic trainer regulation from the Physical Therapy Board to the State Medical Boards where we reside today. A decade later, Senator Tomlinson's expertise and unwavering support was instrumental for the passage of our 2011 Licensure Bill.

Senator Tomlinson is an effective public servant. He has been working with the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers Society since he served in the House from 1991-94 in our quest for recognition and status as a licensed health care profession. Later as Senator from District 6, from 1995 to the present, with his expertise and unwavering support, we have accomplished that goal.

Senator Tomlinson started his political career as a community leader, serving as president of the Bensalem School Board, on the St. Mary Medical Advisory Board. He is a member of the

West Chester University Council of Trustees. In the Senate, he serves as Vice Chair on the Senate Appropriations Committee; Chair of the Senate Consumer Protection & Professional Licensure Committee; Community Economic and Recreation Development Committee; Education Committee; Transportation Committee; and Veterans Affairs, Emergency Preparedness Committee.

A native of Bensalem, Senator Tomlinson was an outstanding athlete and took his academic and athletic talent to West Chester State College graduating with a Bachelors Degree in 1970. As a Golden Ram student athlete, he was a member of the State Conference Championship football teams in 1967 and 1969. The 1967 Team went on to play in the Tangerine Bowl in Florida and he captained the 1969 team. While playing football at West Chester, Tommy was injured and subsequently cared for by another Hall of Famer named Phil Donley. This early experience would cement Tommy's opinion and impressions of Athletic Trainers in the future. Mr. Donley's knowledge and willingness to go the extra step to provide quality health care is something Tomlinson remembers to the present day. After his playing days ended, Tommy went to Miami Dade University in 1971 and received his Mortuary Science degree and is owner of the family business in Bensalem; The Tomlinson Funeral Home.

During our quest for legislative recognition as a health care profession, Senator Tomlinson's use of his political experience, expertise and a genuine appreciation of the services provided by athletic trainers were vital to our political success. The end result was professional Licensure.

On behalf of the 3,000 Athletic Trainers in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, we thank you and appreciate your tireless work for our profession during this long process.

2012 Hall of Fame Inductee



Paul G. Slocum

Paul Slocum's roots are in Sutton, Massachusetts, a small rural town, where his interest in Athletic Training was nurtured by a caring basketball coach and a neighboring college athletic trainer at Holly Cross University, Bill Sanko (NATA, Hall of Famer 1986). By this time Paul was a graduate of the Cramer Company's Student Athletic Training correspondence course.

Slocum completed his undergraduate degree with a major in Biology and a minor in Physical Education, at Dakota Wesleyan University (1971). During his undergraduate preparation he continued to work as an athletic training student under his Team Physician, Dr. Jack Berry. A Physical Therapist, Neil Meyers often came to the university and treated the athletes. Meyers picked up on Slocum's interest in "helping athletes get better" and suggested that he continue his studies by enrolling in physical therapy (PT) school. Slocum completed a Graduate Physical Therapy Certificate Program at the University of Pennsylvania in 1973. During that time his interest in athletic training was increased when he was befriended by Don Frey, Head Athletic Trainer at the University of Pennsylvania.

A characteristic of Slocum's professional life is that he is a "Maximizer". He often did somewhat related jobs at the same time.

In high school, he was a team manager/student athletic trainer; in college, a student athletic trainer/official; then an athletic trainer/physical therapist. He was the Head Athletic Trainer/Physical Therapist at Bloomsburg University from 1972-1983. He soon realized that he was involved in a professional setting with very little professional organization or unity at the state level.

Slocum became a Certified Athletic Trainer in 1975. He attended the NATA and EATA meetings and through talks with prominent Athletic Trainers such as Dave Tomasi, Fran Sheridan, Mark Keppler, Hal Biggs, Ted Quedenfeld, Otho Davis and others he became a very proactive NATA member. He was part of a group that met in July 1976 at the NATA Annual meeting that voted to form the Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society. In the late 70's and early 80's Paul served as PATS Chair of the Licensure Committee, PATS Eastern Regional Representative and eventually PATS President. Paul states, "It was an exciting, exasperating and worthwhile endeavor. He is indebted to Dave Tomasi and Hal Biggs, two close friends, who provided insight and wise counsel. Also, to Joe Godek, who was tenacious in the fight for licensure, gaining the respect from challengers to licensure for athletic trainers and building the bridge between athletic trainers and physical therapists."

Slocum was the recipient of the EATA Cramer Products Award for Service to Athletic Training in 1981, the PATS Distinguished Merit Award in 1990, and PATS Moose Detty Award in 1996. He has worked with the Keystone Games and the Pennsylvania Senior Games in various roles during the years 1987 -2006.

Later in his career in various Physical Therapy settings he has championed athletic training to support the development of Outreach Programs for local and surrounding high school schools.

Paul and his wife Millie have been married for 34 years and they have one son, Greg, 29, who resides in San Francisco, California.

It is with great honor, pride and respect that we welcome Paul G. Slocum to the Pennsylvania Athletic Training Hall of Fame, Class of 2012.

Stefanie Loh

Stefanie Loh is a sports reporter for the Harrisburg Patriot News and a recipient of the 2012 PATS Service Award. Stefanie has proven herself to be a friend of athletic trainers through her informed reporting and desire for accurate details to the public. Ms. Loh has written many positive press articles over the past year and a half promoting athletic trainers and the patients we serve. In December 2010, Stephanie ended the year with a story titled 2010: The Year of the Concussion. A month later, she interviewed Representative Briggs and Jeff Shields, Director of Athletic Training Services at CPRS Therapy for her article titled: Safety in Youth Sports Act Aims to Safeguard Youths with Concussions. While many local reporters were invited to the 2011 PATS Symposium, Stephanie was the only reporter to attend the PATS Mild Traumatic Brain Injury Forum. Following her attendance she wrote an excellent story entitled Concussions the Focus at Pennsylvania Athletic Trainers' Society Symposium. The take away message from the event that she tried to convey to readers was, "Don't jump to conclusions, but cover all your bases." After that Symposium, Stephanie interviewed several Athletic Trainers to write a three piece series starting in June 2011. The articles were titled: Greenwood High School has difficulty attracting athletic trainers: Technological innovations have helped athletic trainers; and (Athletic) Trainers aid injured high school athletes, but they could come under fire. The most recent article she authored was Athletic trainers must now be licensed to practice in Pennsylvania; once again, Stefanie was there providing us with the positive press. In this article she again took the time to check her facts, interview President Janik and Ashley Moss of Lower Dauphin High School. Because Stefanie continues to go the extra mile when writing her stories about Athletic Trainers, please join me as I present Ms. Stefanie Loh with the 2012 PATS Service Award for all she has done to promote the profession of Athletic Training in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

Henry Michael "Hank" Fijalkowski



As one of the 2012 recipients of the PATS Service Award Henry Michael "Hank" Fijalkowski is a role model for Athletic Trainers throughout the Commonwealth. Hank has worked diligently for more than 30 years providing health care to athletes and serving his profession.

In 1981, Hank began his Athletic Training career when he graduated from West Virginia University with a degree in Physical Education and earned his Athletic Training Certification that same year. After leaving WVU, he attended Kansas State University where he earned an Exercise Physiology Degree and worked as a Graduate Assistant for the University's Football Team. Upon graduation, Kansas State saw fit to hire Hank and he served as both the Head Athletic Trainer and Associate Director of Sports Medicine until 1986. What West Virginia and Kansas lost Pennsylvania gained when in 1986, Henry Fijalkowski signed on at Millersville University and has remained there to this day.

Currently, Mr. Fijalkowski serves Millersville University as an Assistant Professor and Head Athletic Trainer. While completing the duties associated with these titles, Hank has been able to accomplish an impressive list of service activities. He has served as the host Athletic Trainer for numerous PSAC and NCAA Wrestling and Basketball Tournaments. In 2011, Hank was voted President Elect of the Lancaster-Lebanon Athletic Trainers' Association (LLATA) and is currently serving as the President and Webmaster for this Association. He is the co-coordinator of the MU/LLATA High School Sports Medicine Workshop hosted by Millersville University. Hank serves as the Intercollegiate Athletics Department Council Representative to APSCUF, chairs the Department Evaluation Committee for non-tenured faculty, and as one of the Department's Five Year Review Writers.

On a national level, Hank served as the District 2 Representative for both the NATA Placement Committee and the NATA Memorial Resolutions Committee, and has presented at the National Convention educating attendees about the nuances of Resume Writing. His service to PATS is just as impressive. He is a member of Technology Committee, serves as PATS' Webmaster, and chairs the College & University Committee. In 2008, he presented at the Annual Symposium about Current Issues in Collegiate Athletics and in 2009 his presentation was titled Evaluation of Handheld Lightning Strike Detectors.

The Board of Directors would like to thank Hank for all his efforts that have assisted us and allowed us to bring the "News of PATS" to you, the membership. Without his efforts in sending the eblast, the PATS Newsletters, assisting with the online election process, and many, many more, our lives would be more difficult without your dedication. Mr. Henry Michael Fijalkowski has consistently demonstrated the criteria necessary for a PATS Service Award. 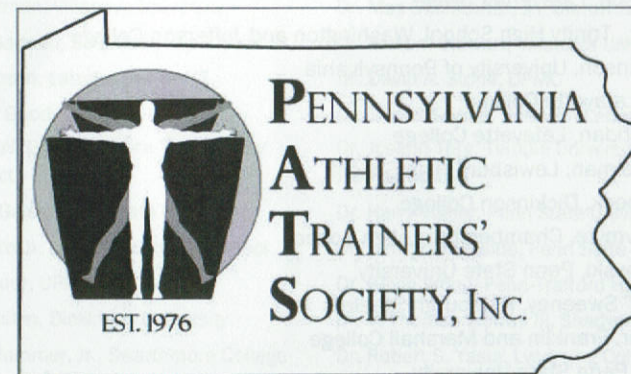

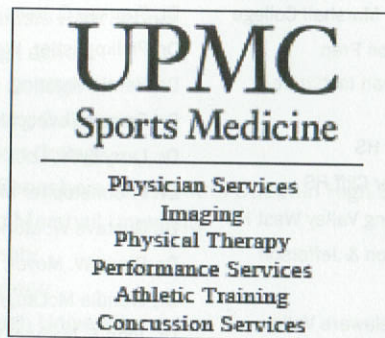

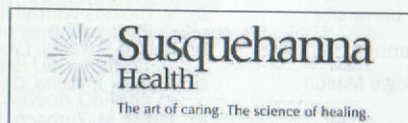
